



Proposition 65

U.S Rubber Recycling, Inc. is fully committed to providing safe and environmentally friendly products to the market place. Our business model is based on finding creative ways to reduce, reuse and recycle materials that would otherwise be discarded in landfills across California. Each year, we recycle millions of pounds of scrap tire rubber, helping to conserve millions of barrels of oil in the process, to convert the scrap material into durable products for the construction, consumer, commercial, industrial, and the sports & leisure markets.

The California Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act, better known as Proposition 65, lists over 775 chemicals that are known to cause cancer and/or birth defects or other reproductive harm. Proposition 65 requires manufactures to provide a “clear and reasonable” warning before knowingly and intentionally exposing anyone to a listed chemical. A “clear and reasonable” warning indicates: (1) That the manufacturer has evaluated the exposure and has concluded that the product contains a listed chemical that exceeds the “no significant risk level” (as defined in Proposition 65); or

(2) The manufacturer has chosen to provide a warning simply based on the knowledge about the presence of a listed chemical without attempting to evaluate the exposure. As our products are manufactured from recycled material in such vast amounts, it is not feasible to test every tire that U.S. Rubber recycles for the presence of a Proposition 65 chemical. U.S. Rubber has chosen to provide a warning based on the premise that one or more of the chemicals listed in Proposition 65 is a possible ingredient in tires. With U.S. Rubber’s products, the exposure may be below the Proposition 65 levels of concern, or could even be zero. However since our business is focused on environmental stewardship and out of an abundance of caution, U.S. Rubber has elected to publish this notice.
